## Summary

- 1) **Leadership Update** (Dave Hill and Siama Rizvi)
  - PACIO leadership led the PACIO-eLTSS Post-Acute Care Transition Summary Track webinar.   - The December 30<sup>th</sup> meeting will be cancelled due to the upcoming holiday.
  
- 2) **Encounters/Episodes of Care Update** (Chris Pugliese)
  - Chris reviewed the two concepts in development:
    - Care Coordination Resource: Create a profile proposal or new resource to support longer-term care offered in the PAC settings, which typically involves multiple treatments from multiple providers on a concurrent timeline.
    - Reassessment Timepoints: Establish another administrative structure or workflow that supports the periods of reassessment and changing patient goals within a longer PAC admission. The group:
      1. Agreed on the existing precedence for an encounter to reflect the entirety of an admission. An opportunity exists to develop a profile defining shorter reassessment timepoints.
      2. Will further analyze and define alignment of timepoints between a clinician's workflow and the PAC facility's workflow.

3. Will consider timepoints for multiple tracks of assessment completion, including structured tracks similar to OASIS and MDS, and multiple tracks of administrative assessments that may be completed in between the structured assessments.
4. Agreed a service request should be a referenceable resource. From a clinical perspective, data elements captured in the standard, regulatory assessment instruments (e.g., OASIS or MDS) provide screening information that may prompt a clinician to order and complete a full evaluation for treatment if certain indicators are present in the assessment responses.
  - Chris will share the workgroup's feedback with the smaller group that meets weekly to define the care coordination and reassessment timepoint concepts. ### 3) Advance Directive Use Case Update (Maria Moen)

- Maria shared the Administrative Steering Division approved the Advance Directive Project Scope Statement (PSS) on December 15.
- The Technical Steering Committee currently is reviewing the PSS and is scheduled to e-vote on approving the PSS by December 27.
- Maria shared revisions to Use Case 1c (Create and Share/Make Available Portable Medical Order for Life-Sustaining Treatment) that incorporate PACIO feedback from the December 9<sup>th</sup> meeting.
