Scope/domain statement for the code system (Official or from HTA)	<p>The Nursing Interventions Classification (NIC) is a standardized classification developed by a research team at the University of Iowa. The purpose of NIC is to define interventions that nurses do on behalf of patients in all care domains. An intervention is defined as "any treatment, based upon clinical judgment and knowledge, a nurse performs to enhance patient/client outcomes." NIC is updated a five-year cycle.</p>
